



Original Bucilla Bedspread Creations

Spider Web Popcorn Bedsread No. 662

The quantity of cotton recommended is sufficient to make a Bedsread (approximately 82 inches × 101 inches, including fringe), for a full size double bed.

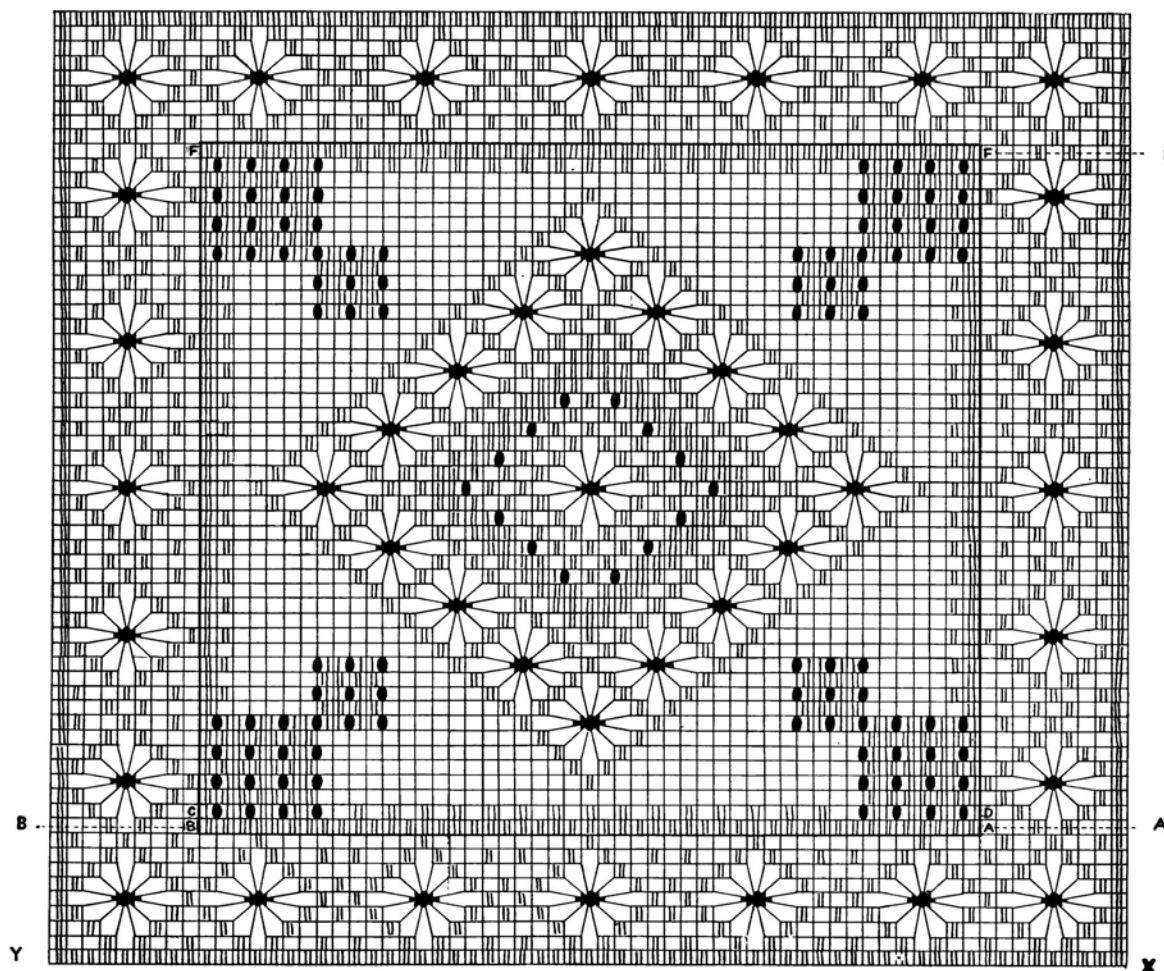
MATERIALS—Bucilla Wondersheen (mercerized) Cotton, Article 3666, 23 skeins,
or
Bucilla Blue Label (delustered) Cotton, Article 3457, 20 skeins.
1 Bucilla Steel Crochet Hook No. 7, Article 4300.

This bedsread is composed of 48 squares—8 squares in length and 6 in width. Size of each square 12 inches.

The chart for Bedsread squares begins at row marked A-B on chart and ends with row marked F-F. The spiderweb border is worked on pillow only.

Squares—Ch 144, 1 d c in 4th st from hook (A on chart), 1 d c in each st to end of chain (B on chart; 142 d c, including the turning ch 3, which counts as the first d c). *2nd row:* (C on chart) ch 3, turn, 1 d c in 2nd d c below (as the ch 3 counts as the first d c), ch 1, skip 1 d c, 6 d c in next st, drop loop from hook, insert hook in top of first d c of group of 6 d c just made, then insert hook in the dropped loop and draw this through st on hook, tighten thread (a popcorn stitch, indicated by oval on chart), * ch 1, skip 1 d c, 1 d c in each of the next 3 d c, ch 1, skip 1 d c, a popcorn in next d c; repeat from * twice, ch 2, skip 2 d c, 1 d c in next d c (a space), ch 2, skip 2 d c, 1 d c in each of the next 4 d c (a block); following the chart, continue to work alternately a space and a block until there are 15 blocks, then work 1 space, ch 2, skip 2 d c,

* a popcorn in next d c, ch 1, skip 1 d c, 1 d c in each of the next 3 d c, ch 1, skip 1 d c; repeat from last * twice, a popcorn in next d c, ch 1, skip 1 d c, 1 d c in next d c, 1 d c in top of turning chain below (D on chart). *3rd row:* ch 3, turn, 1 d c in 2nd d c, 1 d c in space before popcorn, * 1 d c in top of popcorn, 1 d c in space after popcorn, 1 d c in each of the next 3 d c, 1 d c in space before next popcorn; repeat from * twice, 1 d c in top of next popcorn, thus working 22 d c over the 4 popcorns below; 33 spaces over the spaces and blocks below (see chart), then 22 d c to end of row, same as at beginning of row. *4th row:* (see chart) work 4 popcorns and d c over the 22 d c, as described in 2nd row, 16 spaces over the next 16 spaces, 1 block in next space (center of row, beginning of spider), 16 spaces, 4 popcorns and d c over the last 22 d c. *5th row:* work 22 d c over the 4 popcorns, 15 spaces, 1 block over next space, ch 5, 1 block over next space, 15 spaces, 22 d c to end of row. *6th row:* 4 popcorns and d c, as in 2nd row, 14 spaces, 1 block over next space, ch 5, 1 s c under the ch 5 below, ch 5, 1 block over next space (see chart); continue to follow chart to end of row. *7th row:* 22 d c, 13 spaces, 1

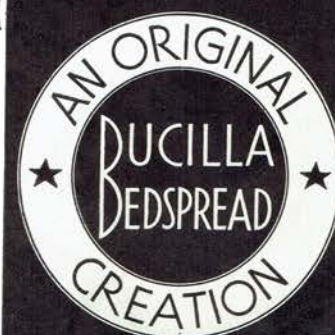

block, ch 5, 2 s c under ch 5 below, 1 s c in next s c (center st), 2 s c under next ch 5, ch 5, 1 block over next space, 13 spaces, 22 d c to end of row. *8th row:* (see chart) 4 popcorns and d c over the 22 d c, ch 1 after the 4th popcorn, 1 d c in space, 1 d c in top of d c, 1 d c in next space, ch 1, a popcorn in next d c, ch 1, 1 d c in space, 1 d c in d c, 1 d c in next space, ch 1, a popcorn in next d c (6 popcorns in group), 8 spaces over the next 8 spaces, 1 block over next space, ch 5, 2 s c in next space, 1 s c in next s c, ch 1, skip 1 st, 1 popcorn in next (center) st, ch 1, skip 1 st, 1 s c in next s c, 2 s c in next space, ch 5, 1 block; continue to follow chart to end of row. *9th row:* 1 block, * ch 2, 1 d c in center d c of the 3 d c between popcorns, ch 2, 1 d c in top of popcorn, repeat from * twice, 12 more d c over the next 2 popcorn patterns (see chart), 7 spaces, 1 block, ch 5, 1 block, ch 5, skip the first 2 s c, 1 s c in next s c, 1 s c in space before the popcorn, 1 s c in top of popcorn, 1 s c in

space after popcorn, 1 s c in next s c, ch 5, 1 block in next space, ch 5, 1 block in next space, 7 spaces over the next 7 spaces, 13 d c over the next 3 popcorn patterns, 6 spaces and 1 block to end of row. *10th row:* 2 blocks (7 d c), 5 spaces, 3 popcorns and d c, 6 spaces, 1 block, ch 5, 1 s c under the ch 5 below, ch 5, 1 block in next space, ch 5, 1 s c in center s c of group of 5 below, ch 5, 1 block, ch 5, 1 s c in next space, ch 5, 1 block, 6 spaces to next popcorn below; follow chart to end. *11th row:* 1 block, 6 spaces, 13 d c over the next 3 popcorns and d c, 5 spaces, 1 block over next space, ch 5, 2 s c under next ch 5, 1 s c in next s c, 2 s c under next ch 5, ch 5, 1 block over next space, ch 2; follow chart to end of row. *12th row:* 2 blocks, 5 spaces, 3 popcorns and d c, 4 spaces, 1 block over next space, ch 5, 2 s c under ch 5 below, 1 s c in next s c, ch 1, skip next s c, a popcorn in next s c (center), ch 1, skip next s c, 1 s c in next s c, 2 s c under ch 5, (Continued on Page 19)

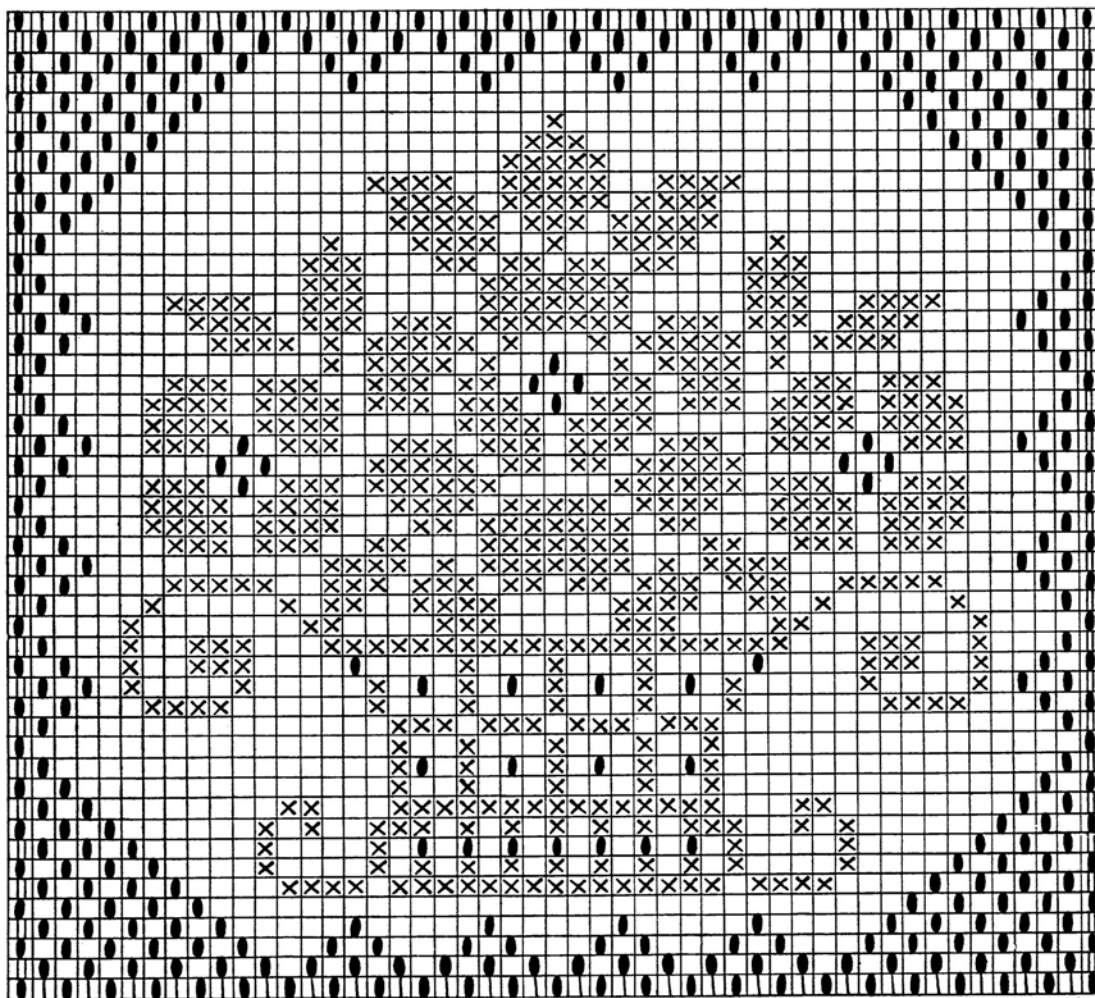

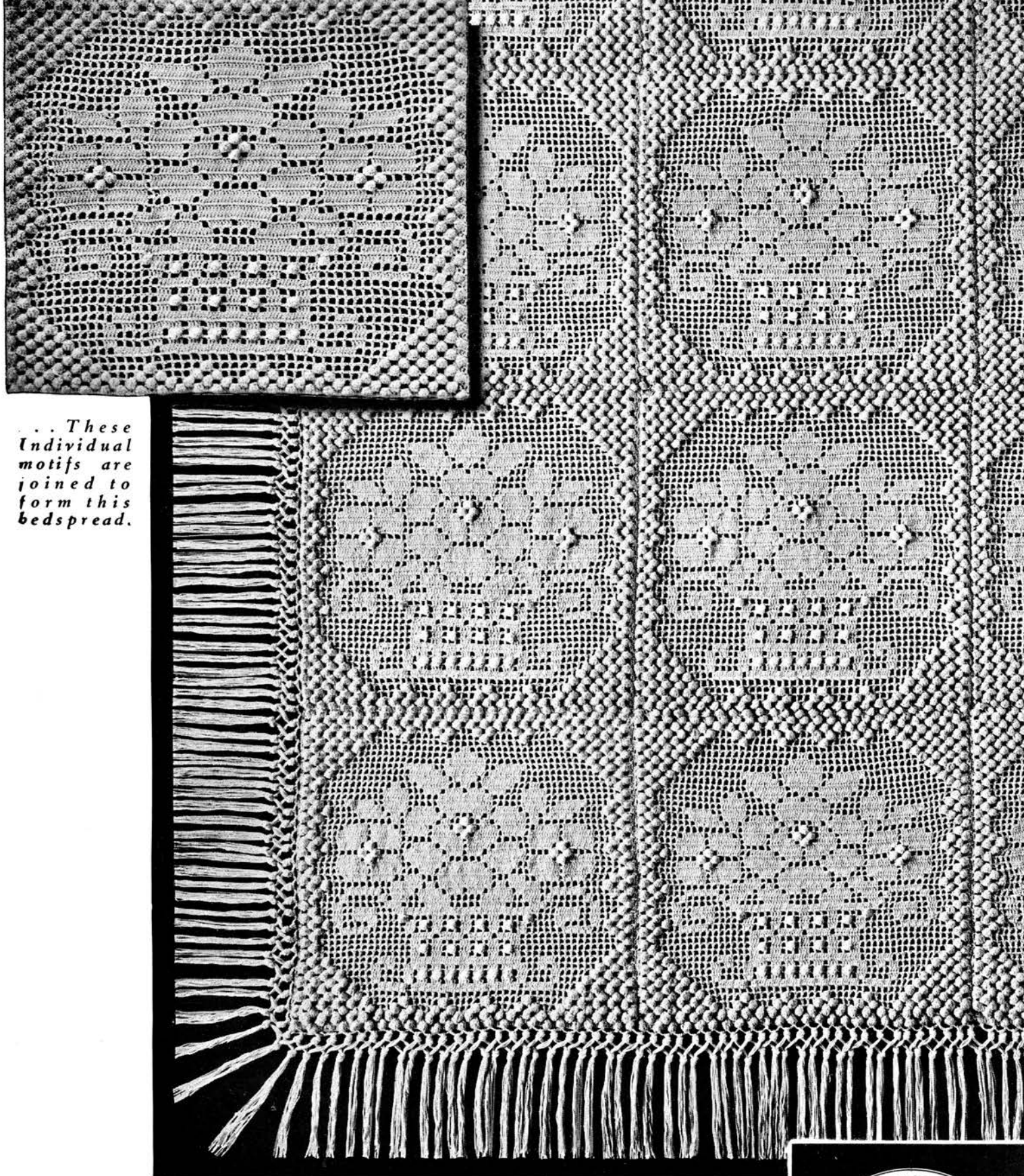
The quantity of cotton recommended is sufficient to make a Bedspread (approximately 82 inches × 101 inches, including fringe), for a full size double bed.

MATERIALS—Bucilla Wondersheen (mercerized) Cotton, Article 3666, 29 skeins,
or
Bucilla Blue Label (delustered) Cotton, Article 3457, 25 skeins.
1 Bucilla Steel Crochet Hook No. 7, Article 4300.

This Bedspread is composed of 48 squares, 8 in length and 6 in width. Each square should measure 12 inches.

Squares—Ch 151, 6 d c in 5th st from hook (A on chart), drop loop from hook, insert this in top of the first of the 6 d c just made, then insert hook

in the dropped loop and draw this through st on hook, tighten thread (this completes the "popcorn" stitch, indicated by oval on chart), * ch 1, skip 1 st on chain, 1 d c in each of the next 3 sts, skip 1 st, 1 popcorn in next st; repeat from * until there are 25 popcorns; end row with ch 1 after last popcorn, skip 1 st on chain, 1 d c in last st. *2nd row:* ch 3, turn, 1 d c in space after the first d c, 1 d c in top of popcorn, 1 d c in next d c, 6 d c in next d c (center st of the group of 3 d c in row below), drop loop from hook, insert hook from back to front in top of the first of the 6 d c just made, insert hook also in the dropped loop and draw this through st on hook, tighten thread (thus forcing the popcorn to right side of work), ch 1, 1 d c in next d c, * ch 2, skip next popcorn, 1 d c in next d c, 1 popcorn in next d c (center st of the group of 3 d c below), ch 1, 1 d c in next d c; repeat from * across, end row with 1 d c in d c before last popcorn in row below, 1 d c in space after the d c, 1 d c in top of popcorn, 1 d c in top st of turning chain (see chart). *3rd row:* ch 3, turn, 1 popcorn in 2nd d c below (right over the popcorn in 1st row), ch 1, skip 1 d c, 1 d c in next d c, * ch 2, skip the popcorn, 1 d c in next d c on other side of popcorn, 1 popcorn in next space, ch 1, 1 d c in next d c; repeat from * 4 times, ending with the d c after the 6th popcorn (see chart); * ch 2, 1 d c in d c after next popcorn, ch 2, 1 d c in next d c, ch 2, 1 d c in d c after next popcorn, 1 popcorn in next space, ch 1, 1 d c in next d c, ch 2, 1 d c in d c after next popcorn, 1 popcorn in next space, ch 1, 1 d c in next d c; repeat from last * 3 times (see chart); 3 more spaces, work popcorns and spaces as on chart to end of row. *4th row:* ch 3, turn, 1 d c in space after d c below, 1 d c in top of popcorn; * 1 d c in next d c, 1 popcorn (as in 2nd row) in next space, ch 1, 1 d c in next d c, ch 2, 1 d c in d c on other side of popcorn below; repeat from * until there are 5 popcorns, then work 5 spaces; continue to

follow chart to end of row. *5th row:* follow directions for 3rd row until there are 5 popcorns, then work 31 spaces and 5 popcorn blocks, as at beginning of row. *6th row:* follow directions for 4th row until there are 4 popcorns, then work 4 spaces, ending with a d c over a d c; * 2 d c in next space, 1 d c on next d c, repeat from * 3 times (13 d c in all, over 4 spaces in row below, see chart); continue pattern as on chart to end of row. *7th row:* follow directions for 5th row until there are 4 popcorns, then work 4 spaces, ending with a d c over a d c; 2 d c in next space, 1 d c on next d c, ch 2, skip 2 d c, 1 d c on next d c; continue pattern as on chart to end of row. *8th row:* follow directions for 4th row until there are 3 popcorns; 5 spaces, 4 d c over next 4 d c below, 4 spaces over the next 4 spaces, 4 d c over next 4 d c; * ch 2, 1 d c on next d c, 1 popcorn on next d c, ch 1, skip 1 d c, 1 d c on the last of the 4 d c below; repeat from * until there are 7 popcorn blocks; pattern as on chart to end of row. Continue in this way to follow chart to end; break off.

Make 48 of these squares. Sew them together as shown in illustration; when sewing, work from wrong side and take up only 1 thread from each edge; be careful to have corners meet exactly; use same thread as for crocheting.

Edging for Fringe—Work 1 s c in upper left hand corner of bedspread, * ch 5, skip 1 row, 1 s c in next row; repeat from * along side, ending with 1 s c in corner st, ch 5, 1 s c in first popcorn on lower edge, * ch 5, 1 s c in next popcorn; repeat from last * to next corner, work along other side of bedspread same as first; do not work along upper edge; break off.

Fringe—Wind thread over a 7-inch cardboard, cut at one end, tie a 6-strand fringe in each mesh, divide fringe and tie another knot $\frac{1}{2}$ inch below first knot, taking 6 strands from the first fringe and 6 strands from the 3rd fringe, as shown in illustration.

Rose Leaf Bedspread No. 667

The quantity of cotton recommended is sufficient to complete a Bedspread (approximately 83 inches \times 102 inches, including fringe), for a full size double bed.

MATERIALS—Bucilla Wondersheen (mercerized) Cotton, Article 3666, 35 skeins,

or

Bucilla Blue Label (delustered) Cotton, Article 3457, 30 skeins.

1 Bucilla Steel Crochet Hook No. 7, Article 4300.

Hexagon—Each hexagon should measure $13\frac{1}{4}$ inches diagonally, from point to point.

Ch 6, join with a slip st into a ring. *1st round:* 12 s c in ring, join with a slip st in first s c of round. *2nd round:* ch 5, 5 d c in next st, drop loop from hook, insert this in first d c of group of 5 d c just made and draw dropped loop through, tighten thread (a popcorn st), * ch 2, 1 d c in next st, ch 2, 1 popcorn in next st; repeat from * around, ending with 1 popcorn, ch 2; join with a slip st in 3rd st of ch 5 at beginning of round (6 popcorns in round). *3rd round:* ch 5, 1 popcorn in space before first popcorn below, * ch 2, 1 d c in top of next popcorn, ch 2, 1 popcorn in space under ch 2 after same popcorn, ch 2, 1 d c in next d c, ch 2, 1 popcorn in space before next popcorn; repeat from * around, ending with 1 popcorn, ch 2, join with a

slip st in the 3rd st of ch 5 at beginning of round (12 popcorns in round). *4th round:* ch 3, 1 popcorn in space before first popcorn in row below, ch 2, 1 popcorn in space after same popcorn, * ch 2, 1 popcorn in space before next popcorn below, ch 2, 1 popcorn in space after same popcorn; repeat from * around, ending with ch 2, join with a slip st in top of ch 3 (24 popcorns in round). *5th round:* 1 slip st in top of next popcorn, ch 5, * 1 popcorn in next space, ch 2, 1 d c in top of next popcorn, ch 2; repeat from * around, ending with ch 2, join as in 3rd round (24 popcorns in round). *6th round:* ch 4, 1 d c in space before first popcorn, * ch 1, 1 d c in next space, repeat from * 7 times, ch 1, 1 d c in same space as last d c (an increasing space); * ch 1 and 1 d c in each of the next 8 spaces, ch 1, 1 d c in same space as last d c; re-

peat from last *, ending round with 1 d c in space after last popcorn in round below, ch 1, join with a slip st in 3rd st of ch 4 at beginning of round (6 increases in round, which forms a hexagon). *7th round:* 1 slip st under remaining st of ch 4, ch 4, 1 d c in same space as slip st just made, * ch 1 and 1 d c in each of the next 9 spaces, ch 1, 1 d c in same space as last d c (an increased space in round below); repeat from *, ending round with 1 d c in space before joining st of round below, ch 1, a slip st in 3rd st of ch 4 at beginning of 7th round (6 increases in round). *8th round:* 3 s c in space before first d c in preceding round, * 1 s c in next space, 1 s c in next d c; repeat from * 7 times, 1 s c in next space, skip next d c and work 3 s c in next (corner) space, skip next d c. Continue in this way to work 17 s c between corner spaces, and 3 s c in each corner skipping the d c on each side of corner space; end round with 1 s c in last space and 1 slip st in first s c of round. *9th round:* 3 s c in next s c (the center st of group of 3 s c below), taking up only top thread of sts, * 1 s c on each of the next 19 sts (whenever a s c row is worked on a s c row, take up top thread only of all sts; this will not be mentioned again), 3 s c in next center st; repeat from * around, ending with 1 s c in slip st at beginning of round and 1 slip st in first s c of round. *10th round:* 3 s c in next st (center of group below), * 1 s c in each st to center st of next corner (21 s c), 3 s c in center st; repeat from * to end of round, 1 s c in the slip st and 1 slip st in first s c of round. *11th round:* same as 10th round (23 s c between corner groups, 156 s c in round). *12th round:* 1 slip st in next s c (center of group below), ch 4, 1 d c in same st as last slip st (an increasing space), * ch 1, skip 1 s c, 1 d c on top thread of next s c (a space), 12 more spaces, * ch 1, 1 d c in same st as last d c (corner st), 13 spaces to next corner; repeat from last *, ending round with ch 1, skip last s c of round, join as in 6th round. *13th round:* 1 slip st under remaining st of ch 4, ch 4, 1 d c in same space as slip st just made (an increasing space), 14 spaces, ending with 1 d c in next corner space, ch 1, 1 d c in same corner space; continue in this way around, join as in 7th round. *14th round:* work same as in 8th round (27 s c between corner groups of 3 s c). *15th round:* same as 9th round (29 s c between corner groups). Continue in this way for 2 more rounds, always working 3 s c in center st of each corner group. In the 17th round there will be 33 s c between corner groups; end with a joining slip st in first s c of 17th round and 1 slip st in next st. *18th round:* work same as in 12th round; there will be 18 spaces between corner spaces. *19th round:* same as 13th round, there will be 19 spaces between corner spaces. *20th round:* 3 s c in corner space, 1 s c in each d c and 1 s c in each space (39 s c between corner spaces); 1 slip st in first s c of round. Work 3 more rounds of s c, making 3 s c in center s c of each corner group. In the 23rd round there will be 45 s c between corner groups. *24th round:* same as 12th round; there will be 24 spaces between corner spaces. *25th round:* same as

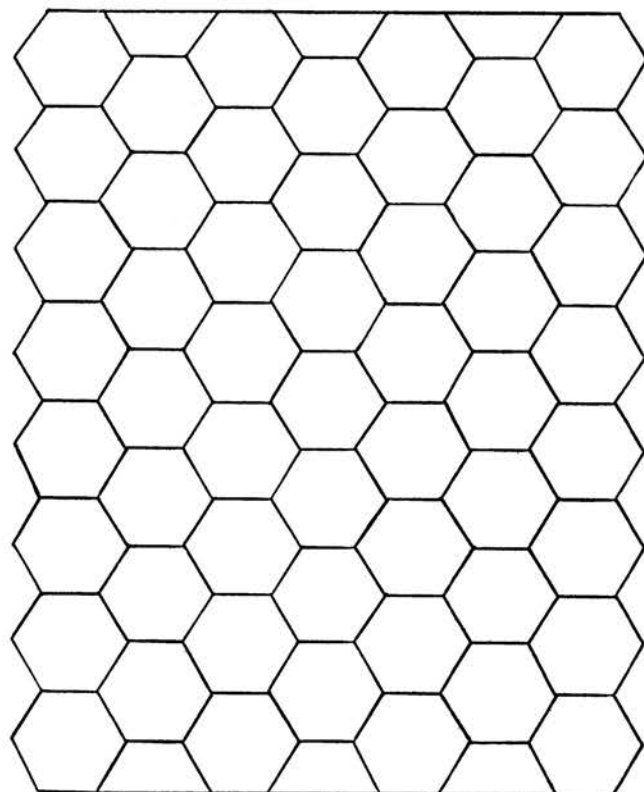
13th round (25 spaces between corner spaces). *26th round:* same as 20th round (51 s c between corner groups). Work 3 more rounds of s c, same as 21st, 22nd and 23rd rounds. There will be 57 s c between corner groups in 29th round. *30th round:* same as 18th round (30 spaces between corner spaces). *31st round:* same as 13th round (31 spaces between corner spaces). *32nd round:* same as 20th round (63 s c between corner groups). *33rd round:* 3 s c in center st of corner group, 1 s c in each of next 5 s c, * 1 popcorn in next s c (taking up top thread only, as in the s c sts), 1 s c in each of next 4 s c; repeat from * 11 times (12 popcorns), 3 s c in next st (center st of corner group); continue in same way on remaining 5 sides of hexagon, ending with 4 s c after the last popcorn on 6th side, join with a slip st in first s c of round. *34th round:* 3 s c in corner st and 1 s c in each st (67 s c between corner groups), join as before, fasten off. Make 53 hexagons.

Leaves—Ch 13, 12 s c on chain, 2 s c in same st as last s c, 11 s c on other side of chain. *2nd row:* ch 1, turn, 1 s c in each of the first 12 sts, taking up only the back thread of sts, 3 s c in next st (point st), 1 s c in each of the next 10 sts. *3rd row:* ch 3, turn, 1 slip st on back thread of first s c (a picot), 1 s c in each of the next 10 sts taking up the back threads only, as before, 3 s c in next (point) st, 1 s c in each of next 10 sts. *4th row:* ch 3, turn, 1 slip st in first st to complete picot, 1 s c in each of the next 10 sts, 3 s c in next (point) st, 1 s c in each of next 9 sts. *5th row:* ch 3, turn and complete the picot, 1 s c in each of next 9 sts, 3 s c in point st, 1 s c in each of next 9 sts. *6th row:* ch 3, turn and complete picot, 1 s c in each of next 9 sts, 3 s c in point st, 1 s c in each of next 8 sts. *7th row:* ch 3, turn and complete picot, 1 s c in each of next 8 sts, 3 s c in point st, 1 s c in each of next 8 sts, ch 3, 1 slip st in last s c, fasten off. Make 18 leaves for each hexagon, place them as shown in illustration, and sew on.

Half-Hexagon—Ch 8, join with a slip st into a ring, 7 s c in ring. *2nd row:* ch 1, turn, 2 s c in first s c (take up top thread only of all s c sts, this will not be mentioned again), * 1 s c in next st, 3 s c in next st, repeat from * once; 1 s c in next st, 2 s c in last st. *3rd row:* ch 1, turn, 1 s c in each of the 13 sts of last row. *4th row:* ch 1, turn, 2 s c in first st, * 1 s c in each of the next 3 sts, 3 s c in next st (a corner group), repeat from * once; 1 s c in each of next 3 sts, 2 s c in last st. *5th row:* ch 4, turn, 1 d c in first s c (an increasing space), * ch 1, skip 1 s c, 1 d c in next s c, ch 1, skip 1 s c, 1 d c in next s c, ch 1, skip 1 s c, 1 d c in next s c, ch 1, 1 d c in same st as last d c (an increasing space); repeat from * twice. *6th row:* ch 4, turn, 1 d c in first space, * ch 1, 1 d c in next space, ch 1, 1 d c in next space, ch 1, 1 d c in next space (corner), ch 1, 1 more d c in corner space; repeat from * twice. *7th row:* ch 1, turn, 2 s c in first space, † 1 s c in next space, * 1 s c in next d c, 1 s c in next space, repeat from * twice, 3 s c in next (corner) space; repeat

from † twice, but in last space (at end of row) work only 2 s c. *8th row:* ch 1, turn, 2 s c in first s c, * 1 s c in each of next 9 s c, 3 s c in next st (center st of corner group); repeat from * once, 1 s c in each of next 9 s c, 2 s c in last st. *9th row:* ch 1, turn, 2 s c in first s c, * 1 s c in each st to center st of next corner group (11 s c between corner groups), 3 s c in next (center) st; repeat from * twice, but in last st (at end of row) work only 2 s c. *10th row:* same as 9th row (13 s c between corner groups). *11th row:* ch 4, turn, 1 d c in first s c, ch 1, skip 1 s c, 1 d c in next s c (a space), 7 more spaces, * ch 1, 1 d c in same st as last d c (center st of corner group), 8 spaces; repeat from * once, then ch 1, 1 more d c in last st of row. *12th row:* ch 4, turn, 1 d c in first space, * 1 space in each space to next corner space, ch 1, 1 more d c in same corner space; repeat from * twice (9 spaces between corner spaces). *13th row:* ch 1, turn, 2 s c in first space, * skip next d c, 1 s c in each space and 1 s c in each d c to the d c before next corner space, skip this d c, 3 s c in corner space; repeat from * twice, but work only 2 s c in last space of row (17 s c between corner groups). *14th row:* same as 9th row (19 s c between corner groups). *15th row:* same as 9th row (21 s c between corner groups). *16th row:* same as 9th row (23 s c between corner groups). *17th row:* work as in 11th row, there will be 13 spaces between corner spaces. *18th row:* same as 12th row (14 spaces between corner spaces). *19th row:* same as 13th row (27 s c between corner groups). Work 3 more rows of s c, increasing at corners as before. *23rd row:* same as 11th row (18 spaces between corner spaces). *24th row:* same as 12th row (19 spaces between corner spaces). *25th row:* ch 1, turn, 2 s c in first space, * 1 s c in each d c and 1 s c in each space to next corner space, 3 s c in corner space; repeat from * twice (39 s c between corner groups), but in space at end of row work only 2 s c. Work 3 more rows of s c, increasing at corners as before. *29th row:* same as 11th row (24 spaces between corner spaces). *30th row:* same as 12th row (25 spaces between corner spaces). *31st row:* same as 25th row (51 s c between corner groups). Work 3 more rows of s c, increasing at corners as before. *35th row:* same as 11th row (30 spaces between corner spaces). *36th row:* same as 12th row (31 spaces between corner spaces). *37th row:* same as 25th row (63 s c between corner groups). *38th row:* ch 1, turn, 2 s c in first st, * 1 s c in each of next 4 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, repeat from * until there are 12 popcorns, 1 s c in each of next 5 sts, 3 s c in next st (center st of corner group), continue in same way on remaining 2 sides and end with 2 s c in last st. *39th row:* ch 1, turn, 1 s c in each st to corner, 3 s c in corner st, 1 s c in each st to next corner, 3 s c in corner st, 1 s c in each st to end of row, fasten off. Make 6 rose leaves for each half-hexagon, and sew on as shown in figure 1. Darn in ends. Make 6 half-hexagons.

Arrange hexagons and half-hexagons as shown on chart, sew the pieces together from wrong side with an overhand stitch, taking care that corners meet exactly and that seams do not bind.



Edging—Beginning at upper right corner, make 1 d c in corner st, ch 2, 1 more d c in same corner st, * ch 2, skip 1 st on upper edge, 1 d c in next st, repeat from * to first seam; work 3 meshes over 2 open rows, 3 meshes over the 4 s c rows, and 1 mesh over each popcorn row across half-hexagon; continue in this way to next corner, ending with 1 d c in corner st; ch 2, 1 d c in same corner st, * ch 2, skip 1 st on side edge, 1 d c in next st, repeat from last * to point of hexagon, ch 2, 1 d c in same st on point as last d c; continue in this way around the entire spread, always working an extra mesh at points and corners.

Fringe—Wind thread around a 6-inch cardboard and cut at one end. Tie a fringe of 6 strands in each space along the 2 sides and one end of bedspread.

Note: This Bedspread may also be made in Unbleached and Beige.


MATERIALS: Bucilla Wondersheen (mercerized) Cotton, Article 3666, 24 skeins Ivory and 11 skeins Dark Ecru,

or

Bucilla Blue Label (delustered) Cotton, Article 3457, 21 skeins Unbleached and 9 skeins Beige.

In the *Hexagons* work the first 2 rows with beige, the 3rd row with unbleached, the 4th row with beige, and the rest with unbleached. Make the *Half-Hexagons* with unbleached, and the *Rose Leaves* with beige. Work the row of spaces around bedspread with unbleached.

Fringe—* Tie 6 strands of unbleached in first space on side, skip 1 space, tie 6 strands of beige in next space, skip 1 space; repeat from * on 3 sides of bedspread.

Rose Leaf Bedspread No. 667

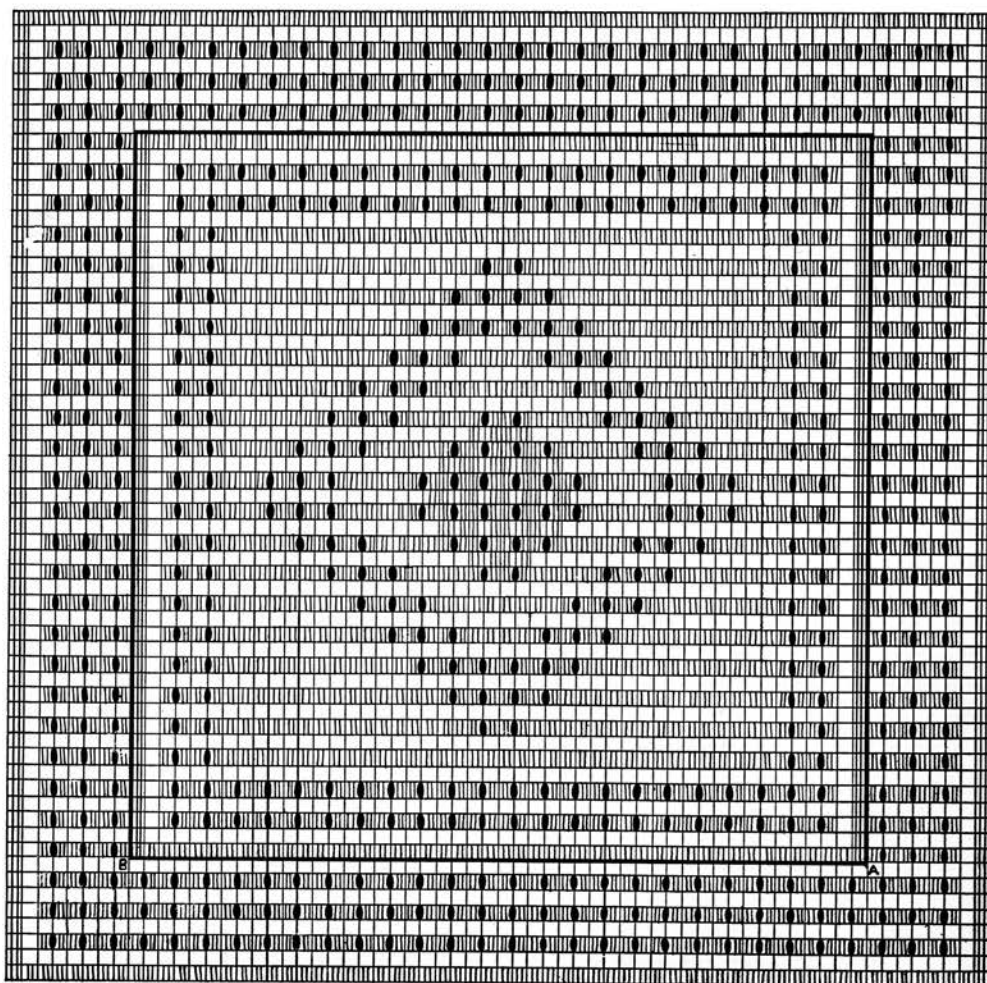

1 Bucilla Steel Crochet Hook, No. 7, Article 4300.

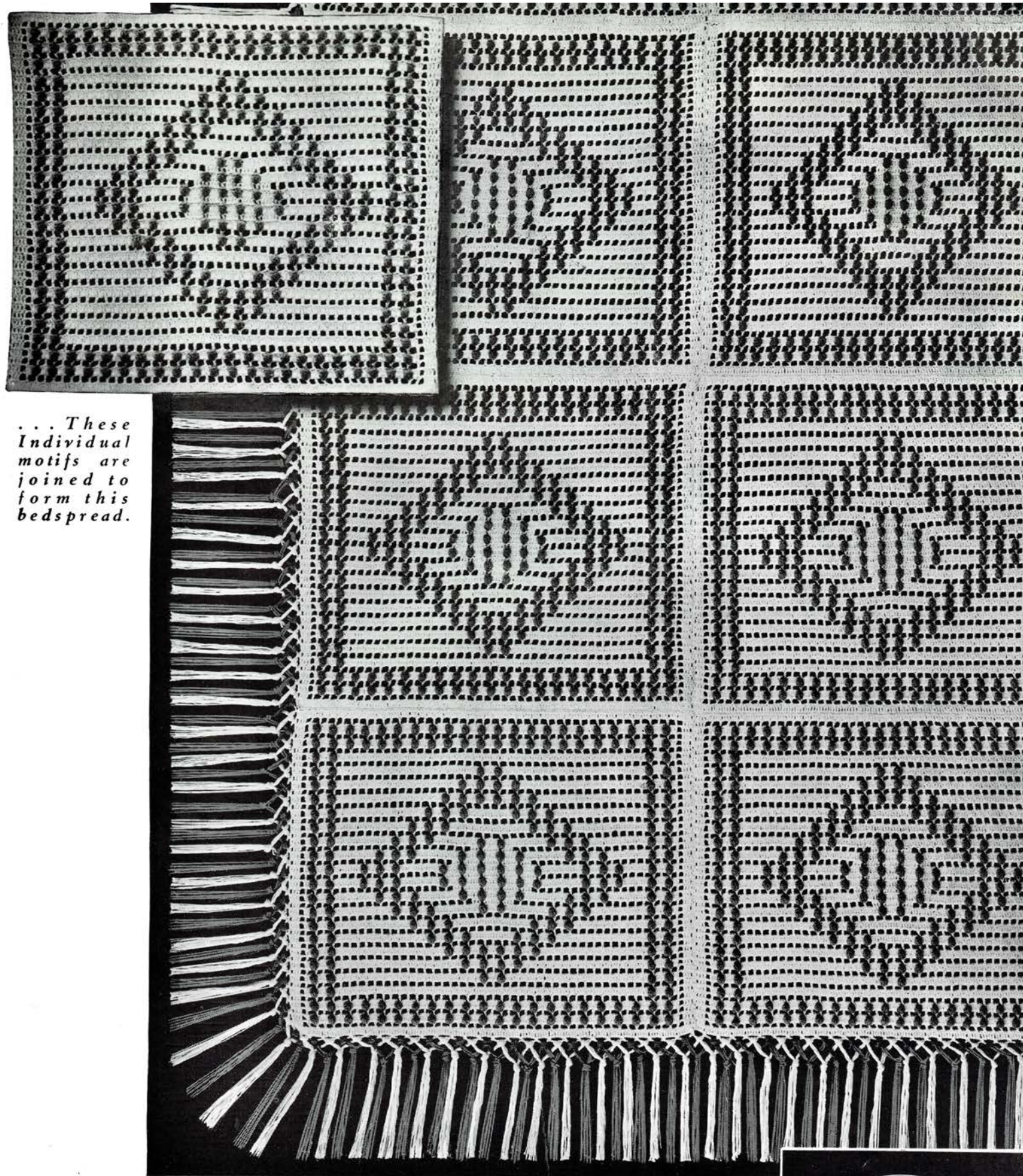
Gauge: 4 rows=1 inch 25 d c=2 inches

The entire background of this Bedspread is worked with unbleached, and the popcorn design is worked with color.

With unbleached ch 147, 1 d c in 4th st from hook (A on chart), 1 d c in each st to end of chain (B on chart; 145 d c in row, including turning ch 3 at beginning of row). *2nd row:* ch 3, turn, skip the first d c (as the ch 3 counts as the first d c; this will not be mentioned again), 1 d c in each of next 3 d c, ch 2, skip 2 d c, 1 d c in next d c (a space), 45 more spaces, 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c, 1 d c in top st of turning chain below (see chart). *3rd row:* ch 3, turn, 1 d c in each of next 3 d c, ch 2, 1 d c in next d c; lay colored thread along top of row below, with unbleached work 1 d c in next space taking the sts over the colored thread (the color not in use is always carried along inside the d c sts), change color in next st, as follows: thread over, draw up a loop in same space as last d c, thread over and through 2 loops on hook, drop unbleached, pick up colored thread and draw through the 2 remaining unbleached loops on hook (always change in this way from unbleached to color), lay

unbleached thread along top of last row and with color work 5 d c in the next d c, taking the sts over the unbleached thread; drop loop from hook, insert hook in top of the first d c of group of 5 d c just made, then insert hook in the dropped loop and draw it through, tighten thread (a popcorn st), drop color, * pick up unbleached and draw a loop through the colored loop on hook (always change in this way from color to unbleached), with unbleached work 2 d c in next space, 1 d c in next d c, 1 d c in next space, 1 d c in same space, changing to colored thread, 1 colored popcorn in next d c; repeat from * until 22 popcorns have been completed; change to unbleached as before, 2 d c in next space, 1 d c in next d c, break off color, ch 2, 1 d c in each of next 3 d c, 1 d c in top st of turning chain below. *4th row:* ch 3, turn, 1 d c in each of the next 3 d c, ch 2, skip the ch 2 below, 1 d c in next d c, * ch 2, skip 2 d c, 1 d c in top of popcorn, ch 2, skip 2 d c, 1 d c in next d c (center st of the 5 d c between popcorns in row below); repeat from * until there are 45 spaces, then ch 2, a block of 4 d c over the block at end of row below. *5th row:* same as 3rd row (a popcorn row, see chart). *6th row:* same as 4th row (a row of spaces). *7th row:* ch 3, turn,

Two-Tone Diamond Popcorn Bedspread No. 666

1 d c in each of next 3 d c, ch 2, lay color along top of last row, 1 d c in next d c, 1 d c in next space, 1 d c in same space changing to color, 1 colored popcorn in next d c, change to unbleached, 2 d c in next space, 1 d c in next d c, 2 d c in next space changing to color in last d c, 1 colored popcorn in next d c, change to unbleached, 2 d c in next space, 1 d c in next d c, 2 d c in next space, 1 d c in next d c; follow chart in this way to end of row, break off color. Continue to follow chart inside the heavy lines. In 19th row begin the center diamond. Follow chart to end of square inside the heavy lines (47 rows).

Make 48 of these 12-inch squares. Arrange squares as shown in illustration, 6 squares in width, 8 squares in length, and sew them together; sew from wrong side and take up only top thread of edge sts; be careful to have corners meet exactly; use same thread as for crocheting.

Edging—Working from right side and beginning at upper left corner, make 1 s c in corner st, * ch 5, skip 1 row on side edge, 1 s c on edge of next row, repeat from * to corner; continue edging along lower edge and on other side; fasten off.

Fringe—Wind thread around a 6-inch cardboard, cut at one end. Tie 6 strands of unbleached in first space of edging, tie 6 colored strands in next space; continue to tie fringes of alternate colors in each space along edge. Tie another row of knots $\frac{3}{4}$ inch below 1st row; tie 6 strands of first unbleached fringe to 6 strands of next colored fringe, tie the 6 remaining strands of first unbleached fringe to 6 strands of next unbleached fringe, tie 6 remaining strands of first colored fringe to 6 strands of next colored fringe. Continue in this way to knot fringe along both long sides and lower edge; see illustration.

Irish Rose Popcorn Bedspread No. 664

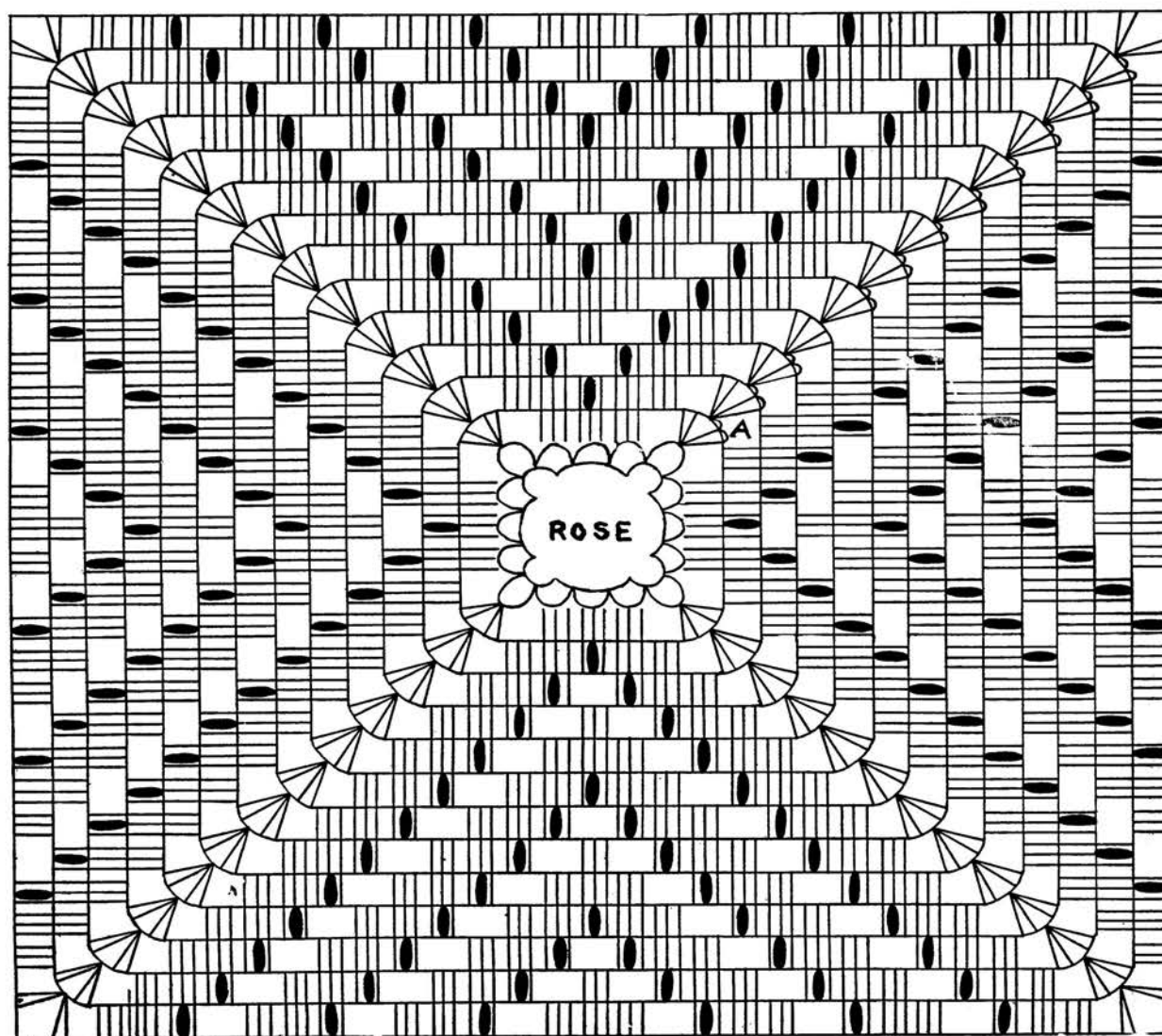

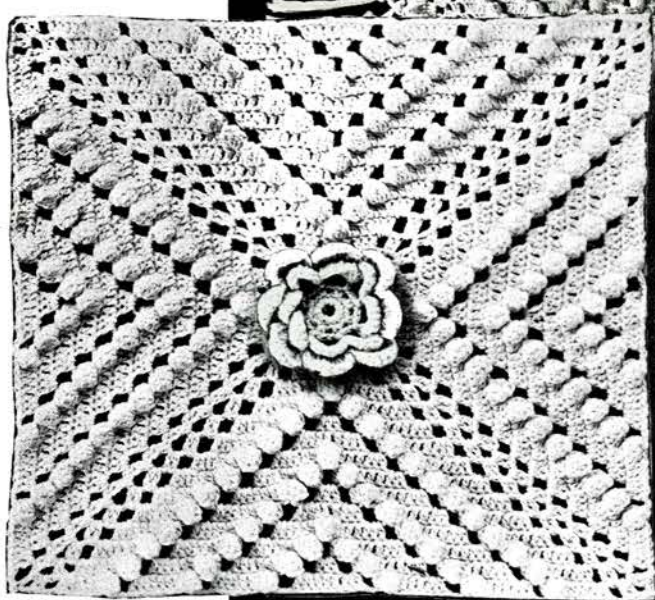

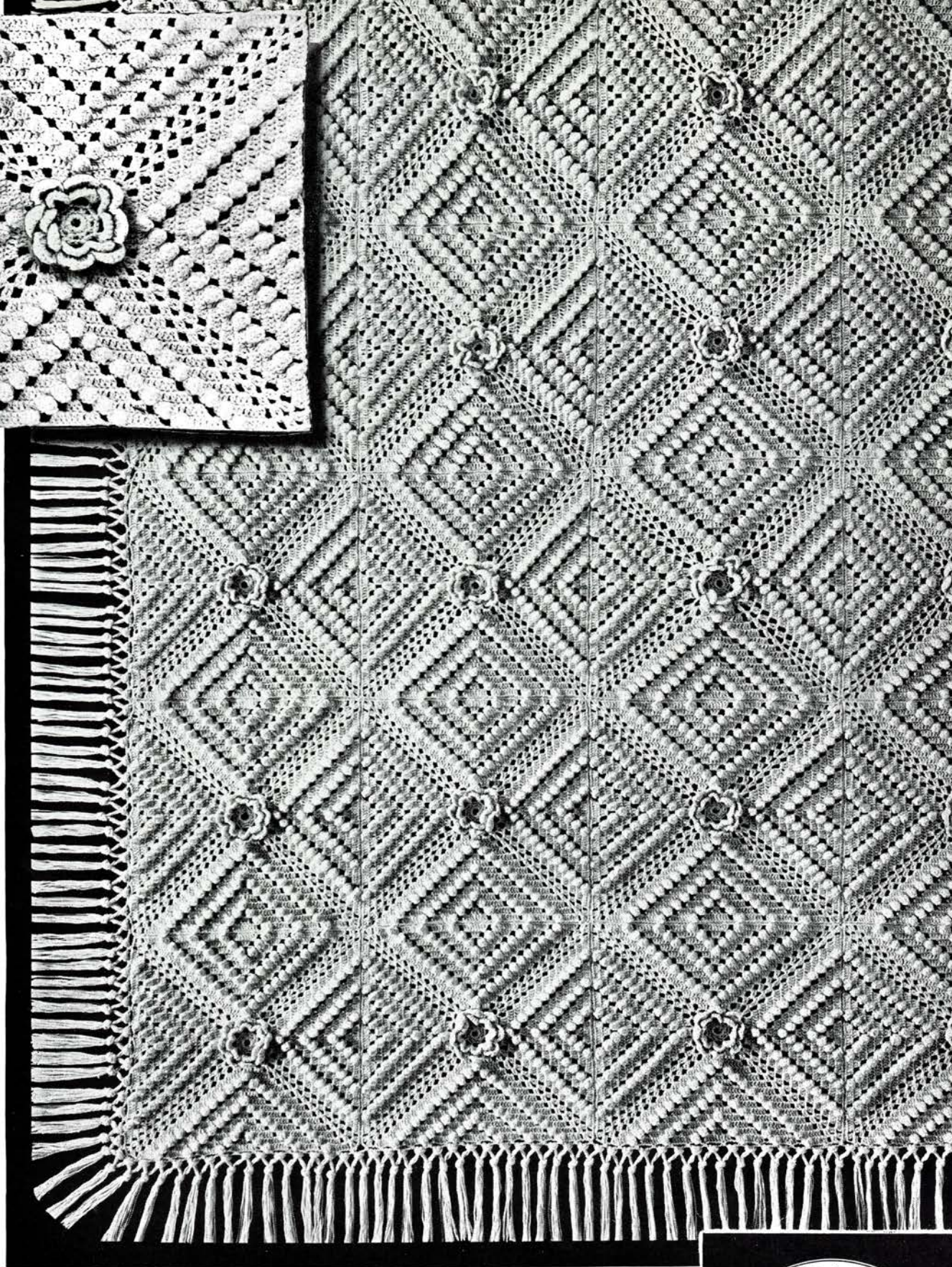

Squares—Rose: Ch 8, join with a slip st into a ring, 16 s c in ring, join with a slip st in first s c of round. *2nd round:* * ch 2, skip 1 st, 1 s c in next st, repeat from * around, ending with 1 s c in slip st at beginning of round (8 spaces in round). *3rd round:* * ch 5, 1 s c in next s c; repeat from * around (8 large spaces in round). *4th round:* 1 s c in first space, 1 s d c in same space (s d c: thread over hook, draw up a loop in same space as last s c, thread over and through all 3 loops on hook), 6 d c, 1 s d c, and 1 s c — all in first space, * 1 s c, 1 s d c, 6 d c, 1 s d c, and 1 s c — all in next space; repeat from * around (8 petals in round). *5th round:* * 1 slip st in first s c, ch 6; with chain behind first petal in last round make 1 s c in back of next s c of 3rd round (between petals of 4th round); repeat from * around (8 chains and 8 s c in round). *6th round:* make a petal of 1 s c, 1 s d c, 3 d c, 3 tr (trebles: thread twice around hook), 3 d c, 1 s d c, 1 s c — all in space under each ch 6 of 5th round, join with a slip st in first s c of round. This completes the rose. *7th round* (1st round shown on chart): * ch 6, with chain behind next petal make 1 s c in back of next s c of 5th round (between petals of 6th round); repeat from * around (8 chains and 8 s c in round). *8th round:* 2 slip sts over first 2 sts of first chain in preceding round, * ch 5, skip next 2 sts of same chain, 1 s c in next st, ch 5, 1 s c in 2nd st of next chain in preceding round; repeat from * around, ending with ch 5, 1 s c in 2nd slip st made at beginning of round (16 spaces in round; see chart). *9th round* (1st filet round): 1 slip st under first ch 5 of last round, ch 3, 1 d c in same space as the slip st, ch 3, 2 d c in same space, ch 2, * 3 d c in each of next 3 spaces; ch 2, 2 d c, ch 3, 2 d c, ch 2 — all in next space (corner); repeat from * around, ending with ch 2, 1 slip st in 3rd st of ch 3 at beginning of round. *2nd filet round:* 1 slip st in top of first d c and 1 slip st in first space (A on chart), ch 3, 1 d c in same space, ch 3, 2 d c in same space, * ch 2, 3 d c in next space formed by ch 2 in preceding round, 1 d c in each of next 4 d c;

6 d c in next d c (center d c of group below), drop loop from hook, insert hook in top of first d c of group of 6 d c just made, then insert hook in the dropped loop and draw this through st on hook, tighten thread (a "popcorn" st, indicated by oval on chart), 1 d c in each of next 4 d c, 3 d c in next space; ch 2, 2 d c, ch 3, 2 d c — all in next (corner) space; repeat from *, ending round with ch 2, 1 slip st in 3rd st of ch 3 at beginning of round, 1 slip st in top of next d c and 1 slip st in first space (each round will be joined in this way; this will not be mentioned again). *3rd filet round:* ch 3, 1 d c in same space as slip st just made, ch 3, 2 d c in same space, * ch 2, 3 d c in next space, 1 d c in each of next 4 d c, 1 popcorn in next d c, 1 d c in next d c (see chart), ch 2, skip 3 sts (1 d c, 1 popcorn, 1 d c), work 1 d c in next st, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of next 4 sts, 3 d c in next space; ch 2, 2 d c, ch 3, 2 d c — all in next (corner) space; repeat from * around, join as before. *4th filet round:* ch 3, 1 d c in same space as last slip st, ch 3, 2 more d c in space, * ch 2, 3 d c in next space, 1 d c in each of next 4 sts, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in next st, ch 2, skip 3 sts (1 d c, 1 popcorn, 1 d c), 3 d c in next space, ch 2, skip 3 sts (1 d c, 1 popcorn, 1 d c), 1 d c in next st, 1 popcorn in next st, 1 d c in each of next 4 sts, 3 d c in next space; ch 2, 2 d c, ch 3, 2 d c — all in next space (corner, see chart); repeat from * around, join as before. Continue to follow chart for the remaining part of square; fasten off.

Make 108 squares. Sew squares together as shown in illustration; when sewing, work from wrong side and take up only top thread of edge sts; be careful to have corners meet exactly; use same thread as for crocheting.

Fringe—Make 1 s c in a corner st, working along side, * ch 5, skip 5 sts on edge, 1 s c in next st; repeat from * along both long sides and across one end. Wind thread around a 6-inch cardboard, cut at one end. Knot a fringe of 6 strands in each chain loop; divide the fringes and tie another knot one inch below the first (6 strands from 1 fringe tied with 6 strands of next fringe).

Ch 198, 1 d c in 4th st from hook (X on chart), 1 d c in each st to end of chain (Y on chart; 196 d c on chain, including the turning ch 3 which always counts as 1 d c). *2nd row:* ch 3, turn, 1 d c in each of the next 3 d c, ch 2, skip 2 d c, 1 d c in next d c (a space), ch 2, skip 2 d c, 1 d c in each of next 4 d c (a block), ch 5, skip 2 d c, 1 block of 4 d c on next 4 d c, 2 spaces, 1 block, 2 spaces, 1 block, * ch 5, skip 2 d c, 1 block, 2 spaces, 1 block, 1 space, 1 block, 2 spaces, 1 block; repeat from * 3 times, ch 5, skip 2 d c, 1 block, 2 spaces, 1 block, 2 spaces, 1 block, ch 5, skip 2 d c, 1 block, 2 spaces, 3 d c on the next 3 d c, 1 d c in 3rd st of turning chain below. *3rd row:* ch 3, turn, 1 d c in each of next 3 d c, 1 space over space in row below, 1 block

(see chart), ch 5, 1 s c under center of ch 5 of row below, ch 5, 1 block over next space, 3 spaces, 1 block, * ch 5, 1 s c under next ch 5 in row below, ch 5, 1 block over next space, 5 spaces, 1 block; repeat from * 3 times, continue to follow chart to end of row. *4th row:* ch 3, turn, 2 blocks, ch 5, 2 s c under first ch 5 in row below, 1 s c in next s c, 2 s c under next ch 5, ch 5, 1 block over next space; continue to follow chart to end of row. *5th row:* ch 3, turn, 1 block, ch 5, 2 s c under first ch 5 in row below, 1 s c in next s c, ch 1, skip 1 s c, 6 d c in next s c, drop loop from hook, insert this in top of first d c of group, draw dropped loop through (popcorn st, indicated by oval on chart), ch 1, skip 1 s c, 1 s c in next s c, 2 s c under next ch 5, ch 5, 1 block over next space; follow chart to end of row. *6th row:* ch 3, turn, 1 block, 3 d c under next

ch 5, ch 5, skip first 2 s c, 1 s c in next s c, 1 s c under ch 1 before the popcorn. 1 s c in top of popcorn, 1 s c under ch 1 after the popcorn, 1 s c in next s c, ch 5, 3 d c under ch 5 in row below, 1 d c in next d c, 1 space, 3 d c under next ch 5; follow chart to end of row. *7th row:* ch 3, turn, 1 block, 1 space, 3 d c under next ch 5, ch 5, 1 s c in 3rd s c (center of group below), ch 5, 3 d c under next ch 5, 1 d c in next d c, 3 spaces; follow chart to end of row. *8th row:* ch 3, turn, 1 block, 2 spaces, 3 d c under first ch 5, ch 2, 3 d c under next ch 5, 1 d c in next d c, 2 spaces, 1 block; follow chart to end of row. Follow chart for the *9th* and *10th* row. (Disregard the letters, which refer to the bedspread square). *11th row:* ch 3, turn, 1 block, 1 space, 1 block, ch 5, 1 s c under

center of ch 5 below, 1 block over next space in row below, 2 spaces, 1 d c in next d c, * ch 1, skip 1 d c in row below, 1 popcorn in next d c, ch 1, skip 1 d c, 1 d c in each of next 3 d c; repeat from * twice, ch 1, skip 1 d c, 1 popcorn in next d c, ch 2, skip 2 d c, 1 d c in next d c, 1 space, 1 block; continue to follow chart to end of row. *12th row:* ch 3, turn, 2 blocks, ch 5, 2 s c under first ch 5 of row below, 1 s c in next s c, 2 s c under next ch 5, ch 5, 1 block over next space, 1 space, 1 d c in next d c, * 1 d c in ch 1 before popcorn, 1 d c in top of popcorn, 1 d c in ch 1 after popcorn, 1 d c in each of next 3 d c; repeat from * twice; 1 d c in next ch 1, 1 d c in top of popcorn (22 d c in group), 33 spaces; follow chart to end of row. Continue in this way to work pattern as on chart to end of pillow chart.

With unbleached ch 195, 1 d c in 4th st from hook, 1 d c in each st of chain (193 d c in row, including turning ch 3 at beginning of row). *2nd row:* ch 3, turn, skip the first d c (as the ch 3 counts as the first d c; this will not be mentioned again), 1 d c in each of the next 3 d c, ch 2, skip 2 d c, 1 d c in next d c (a space), 61 more spaces, 1 d c in each of last 2 d c, 1 d c in top of turning ch 3 below (62 spaces and a block of 4 d c at each end of row). *3rd row:* ch 3, turn, 1 d c in each of next 3 d c, ch 2, 1 d c in next d c, lay colored thread along top of row below, with unbleached work 1 d c in next space, taking the st over the colored thread (the color not in use is always carried along inside the d c sts); change color in next d c, as follows: thread over, draw up a loop in same space as last d c, thread over and through 2 loops on hook, drop unbleached, with color draw loop through 2 remaining unbleached loops on hook (always change in this way from unbleached to color), lay unbleached thread along top of last row, with color work 5 d c in next d c, taking the colored sts over the unbleached thread, drop loop from hook, insert this in top of the first d c of the group of 5 d c just made, then insert hook in the dropped loop and draw it through, tighten thread (a popcorn st), drop color, draw an unbleached loop through colored loop on hook (always change in this way from color to unbleached), * with

unbleached work 2 d c in next space, 1 d c in next d c, 1 d c in next space, 1 d c in same space changing to color, 1 colored popcorn in next d c, change to unbleached; repeat from * until 30 popcorns have been completed (see chart), change to unbleached, 2 d c in next space, 1 d c in next d c, break off color, ch 2, a block of 4 d c to end of row. *4th row:* ch 3, turn, 1 d c in each of the next 3 d c, ch 2, 1 d c in next d c, ch 2, 1 d c in top st of popcorn, ch 2, skip 2 d c, 1 d c in next d c (center st of the 5 d c between popcorns in row below); continue in this way to follow chart to end of row. *5th row:* same as 3rd row (a popcorn row, see chart). *6th row:* same as 4th row (a row of spaces). *7th row:* same as 3rd row (a popcorn row, see chart). Continue to follow chart, working across the full width. (Disregard the letters A-B and the heavy lines that begin in 9th row, as they refer to the bedspread.) Continue to follow chart to the 11th row. *11th row:* ch 3, turn, 1 d c in each of the next 3 d c, ch 2, 1 d c in next d c, lay colored thread along top of last row, 2 d c in next space changing to color in the last d c, 1 colored popcorn in next d c, change to unbleached, a group of 5 unbleached d c over the next 2 spaces changing to color in last d c, 1 colored popcorn in next d c, change to unbleached, a group of 5 unbleached d c over next 2 spaces changing to color in last d c, 1 colored popcorn in the next d c, change to unbleached, 2 unbleached d c in next space, 1 d c in each of the next 4 d c, ch 2, 1 d c in next d c carrying colored thread along ch 2 of row below; follow chart to end of row. Continue in pattern to end of chart.

Edging—Work 1 s c in space just before a corner space, ch 3, 1 s c in same space, ch 3, 1 s c in next (corner) space, ch 3, 1 s c in same space, * ch 3, 1 s c in next space, ch 3, 1 s c in same space as last s c, ch 3, skip 3 d c, 1 s c in next d c, ch 3, 1 s c in same st as last s c, ch 3, skip 2 d c, 1 s c in next d c, ch 3, 1 s c in same st as last s c; repeat from * around, working all corners alike.

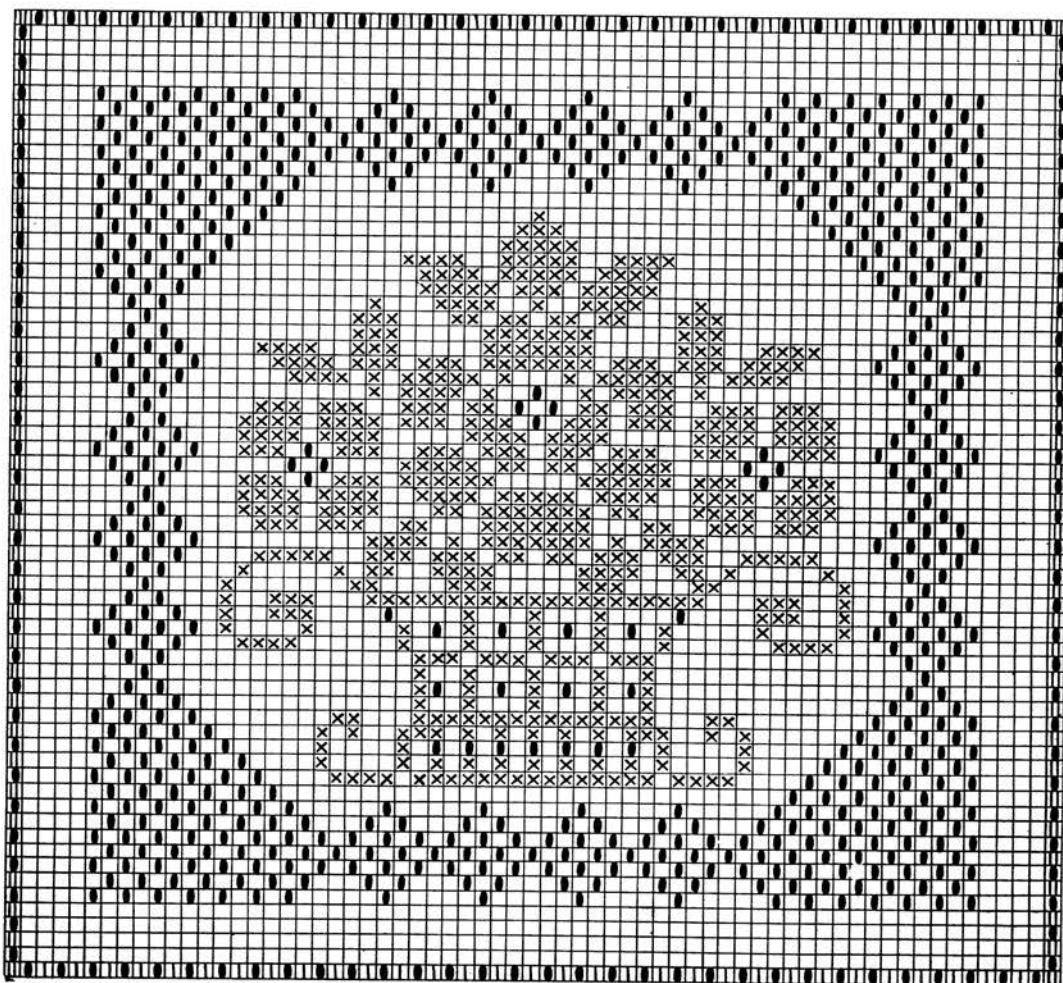

in 2nd row. *5th row:* same as 3rd row. *6th row:* ch 3, turn, 1 popcorn (as in 2nd row) in 3rd d c of row below, ch 1, 1 d c in next d c, 4 spaces ending with a d c, 1 popcorn in next space, ch 1, 1 d c in next d c; * ch 2, 1 d c in next d c, 1 popcorn in next space, ch 1, 1 d c in next d c, repeat from * until there are 7 popcorns in group (see chart); pattern as on chart to end of row. Continue in this way to work popcorn pattern as on chart to end of 13th row. *14th row:* work popcorn pattern as on chart until there are 6 popcorns in group, then make 4 spaces, ending with a d c over a d c; * 2 d c in next space, 1 d c in next d c, repeat from * 3 times (13 d c, in all, over 4 spaces in row below, see chart); continue pattern as on chart to end of row. *15th row:* work popcorn pattern as on chart until there are 5 popcorns in group, then make 4 spaces, ending with a d c over a d c, 2 d c in next space, 1 d c in next d c, ch 2, skip 2 d c, 1 d c in next d c; continue pattern as on chart to end of row. *16th row:* work popcorn pattern as on chart until there are 5 popcorns in group; 5 spaces, 4 d c over next 4 d c below, 4 spaces over the next 4 spaces, 4 d c over next 4 d c; * ch 2, 1 d c on next d c, 1 popcorn on next d c, ch 1, skip 1 d c, 1 d c on the last of the 4 d c below, repeat from * until there are 7 popcorn blocks; pattern as on chart to end of row. Continue in this way to follow chart to end; break off.

Rose Leaf Pillow No. 667

MATERIALS—Bucilla Wondersheen (mercerized) Cotton, Article 3666, 1 skein,

1 Bucilla Steel Crochet Hook No. 7, Article 4300.

Follow directions for hexagon in Bedspread No. 667 to end (34th round). Work 12 additional rounds. *35th round:* 1 s c in each st and 3 s c in center st of corner group (69 s c between corner groups). *36th round:* same as 12th round (36 spaces between corner spaces). *37th round:* same as 13th round (37 spaces between corner spaces). *38th round:* same as 20th round (75 s c between corner groups). Work 3 more rounds of s c, increasing at corners as before. There will be 81 s c between corner groups in last (41st) round. *42nd round:* same as 18th round (42 spaces between corner spaces). *43rd round:* same as 13th round (43 spaces between corner spaces). *44th round:* same as 20th round (87 s c between corner groups). *45th round:*

3 s c in center st of corner group, * 1 s c in each of next 4 s c, 1 popcorn in next s c, repeat from * until there are 17 popcorns, 1 s c in each of the next 4 sts, 3 s c in next (corner) st; continue in same way on remaining 5 sides of hexagon, join with a slip st in first s c in round. *46th round:* same as 34th round (91 s c between corner groups). Fasten off.

Work 18 leaves as for bedspread and sew into place as shown on chart 1 and in illustration.

If desired, this pillow can be made in a combination of Unbleached and Beige. Refer to note in bedspread directions.

Buy Wisely—Buy Enough—At the time the initial purchase of Cotton is made, it is important to buy the complete amount of each color necessary to finish the article. Make sure it is all of one dye lot number, as the next lot number of any color may differ slightly in shade from the original lot purchased, making it impossible to complete the article satisfactorily.

ch 5, 1 block over next space; continue to follow chart to end of row. *13th row:* 1 block, 13 spaces (working the spaces over popcorns in same way as in 9th row), 1 block, ch 5, 1 block over next ch 5, ch 5, skip 2 s c, 1 s c in next s c, 1 s c in space before popcorn, 1 s c in top of popcorn, 1 s c in space after popcorn, 1 s c in next s c, ch 5, 1 block over ch 5, ch 2; follow chart to end of row. *14th row:* 2 blocks, 11 spaces, 1 block over next space, ch 5, 1 s c under ch 5 below, ch 5, 1 block over next ch 5, ch 5, 1 s c in center s c of group of 5 below, ch 5, 1 block over next ch 5, ch 2, 1 block over next space; follow chart to end of row. *15th row:* 1 block, 11 spaces, 1 block, ch 5, 2 s c under next ch 5, 1 s c in next s c, 2 s c under next ch 5, ch 5, 1 block over next ch 5, ch 2, 1 block over next ch 5, a space, 3 blocks (10 d c); follow chart to end of row. *16th row:* 2 blocks, 9 spaces, 1 block, ch 5, 2 s c under next ch 5, 1 s c in next s c, ch 1, skip next s c, a popcorn in next s c, ch 1, skip next s c, 1 s c in next s c, 2 s c under next ch 5, ch 5, 1 block over next space, a space, 5 blocks (16 d c); follow chart to end of row. *17th row:* 1 block, 9 spaces, 1 block, ch 5, 1 block over next ch 5, ch 5, skip 2 s c, 1 s c in next s c, 1 s c in space before popcorn, 1 s c in top of popcorn, 1 s c in space after popcorn, 1 s c in next s c, ch 5, 1 block over next ch 5, a space, 3 blocks, a space; follow chart to end of row. *18th row:* 2 blocks, 7 spaces, 1 block, ch 5, 1 s c under next ch 5, ch 5, 1 block over next ch 5, ch 5, 1 s c in center s c of group of 5 below, ch 5, 1 block over next ch 5, a space, 1 block, 1 d c in each of the next 4 d c, ch 1, skip 1 d c, a popcorn in top of next d c, 1 space, 1 block over center space; follow chart to end of row. *19th row:* 1 block, 7 spaces, 1 block, ch 5, 2 s c under next ch 5, 1 s c in next s c, 2 s c under next ch 5, ch 5, 1 block over next ch 5, ch 2, 1 block over next ch 5, a space, 3 blocks, a space, 1 block over next space, a space; follow chart to end of row. *20th row:* 2 blocks, 5 spaces, 1 block, ch 5, 2 s c under next ch 5, 1 s c in next s c, ch 1, skip 1 s c, a popcorn in next s c, ch 1, skip next s c, 1 s c in next s c, 2 s c under next ch 5, ch 5, 1 block over next space, a space, a group of 8 d c, ch 1, skip 1 d c, a popcorn in top of next

d c, a space, 1 block over next space, a space, 1 block over center space; follow chart to end of row. *21st row:* 1 block, 5 spaces, 1 block over next space, ch 5, 1 block over next ch 5, ch 5, skip 2 s c, 1 s c in next s c, 1 s c in space before popcorn, 1 s c in top of popcorn, 1 s c in space after popcorn, 1 s c in next s c, ch 5, 1 block over next ch 5, a space, 3 blocks, a space, 1 block, 1 space, 1 block, ch 5; follow chart to end of row. *22nd row:* 2 blocks, 3 spaces, 1 block, ch 5, 1 s c under ch 5 below, ch 5, 1 block over next ch 5, ch 5, 1 s c in center s c of group of 5 below, ch 5, 1 block over next ch 5, 1 space, 8 d c, ch 1, skip 1 d c, a popcorn, 1 space, 1 block, a space, 1 block, ch 5, 1 s c under ch 5 below; follow chart to end of row. *23rd row:* 1 block, 3 spaces, 1 block, ch 5, 2 s c under next ch 5, 1 s c in next s c, 2 s c under next ch 5, ch 5, 1 block over next ch 5, ch 2, 1 block over next ch 5, a space, 3 blocks, a space, 1 block, a space, 1 block, ch 5, 2 s c under next ch 5, 1 s c in next s c; follow chart to end of row. *24th row:* 2 blocks, 1 space, 1 block, ch 5, 2 s c under next ch 5, 1 s c in next s c, ch 1, skip 1 s c, a popcorn in next s c, ch 1, skip 1 s c, 1 s c in next s c, 2 s c under next ch 5, ch 5, 1 block, a space, 8 d c, ch 1, skip 1 d c, a popcorn in top of next d c, a space, 1 block, a space 1 block, ch 5, 2 s c under next ch 5, 1 s c in next s c, ch 1, skip 1 s c, a popcorn in next s c; follow chart to end of row.

This completes the 1st half of square; continue in this way to follow chart to end (row F on chart, 47 rows in square); fasten off. Arrange squares 6 in width and 8 in length and sew together with an overhand stitch from wrong side, taking up 2 threads from each edge. Be careful to keep pattern in one direction and seams as elastic as the crocheted fabric.

Work a row of 1 s c—ch 3, in each row along sides of spread, and 1 s c—ch 3, in every 3rd st along lower edge of Spread.

Fringe—Wind thread around a 7-inch cardboard, cut at one end; tie a 6-strand fringe in every other space on edge; tie a second knot 1 inch below first knot, using 6 strands of one fringe and 6 strands of second fringe from the first; see illustration.

HELPFUL HINTS

CHAIN STITCH (ch)—Make a loop on hook, * thread over and through the preceding loop, repeat from * the desired length. Each loop is called one chain st.

CROCHETED SLIP STITCH (slip st)—Insert the hook in next st, thread over and draw through both loops on hook.

SINGLE CROCHET (s c)—Make a chain the length required, turn, insert the hook in 2nd ch from hook and draw thread through it, thread over and through both loops on hook. Continue to work in this way in each ch to end of row. *2nd row:* turn the work, ch 1, * insert the hook in top of next st, taking up both threads, thread over and draw through, having 2 loops on the hook, thread over and through both loops on hook. Repeat from * across row.

DOUBLE CROCHET (d c)—Make a chain the length required, turn, thread over, insert the hook in the 4th ch from hook and draw thread through, having 3 loops on hook; thread over and through 2 loops, again thread over and through 2 loops. For the 2nd st, * over and through next ch, over and through 2 loops and then over and through 2 loops more, as before; repeat from * to other end of chain. *2nd row:* turn, ch 3, over, insert the hook in the top of the 2nd d c of preceding row, taking up both threads, and work off as in 1st row. The chain 3 counts as 1 d c.

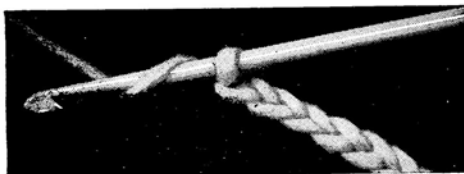

Even means that a row is to be worked without either increase or decrease.
