Hiawatha Beaded Cap and Handbag (Clutch)
One Size*

43 *Cap and bag*

MATERIALS: Hiawatha 2 Ply Lame Yarn, Art. 43, 3 tubes for bag, 3 tubes for hat. Hiawatha 5 mm white pearls No. 6738, 1 string for bag, 1 string for hat. Hiawatha 6mm white pearls No. 6836, 2 pkgs for bag, 2 for hat. Hiawatha Rhinestones No. 6746, 4 pkgs. for bag, 4 pkgs. for hat. Hiawatha Plastic Bag Lining No. 6800.


GAUGE: 2 groups and 2 sps = 1"; 7 rows = 2".

B a g

Ch 72 to measure 8½". *Row 1:* Work sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch to end (71 sc), turn. *Rnd 1:* Ch 3, dc at base of ch-3, ch 1, dc in same place, dc in next st, dc in next st, * ch 1, skip 1 st, dc in each of next 3 sts; repeat from * to end, continuing to work around starting ch, ch 1, 3 dc in same st as last dc (corner), ch 1, dc in same place as 3 dc, dc in each of next 2 sts, * ch 1, skip 1 st, dc in each of next 3 sts; repeat from * across, ending with 3 dc, ch 1, dc at base of ch-3, sl st in top of ch-3. *Rnd 2:* Ch 3, dc at base of ch-3, ch 1, dc in next dc, dc in sp, dc in next dc, ch 1, * skip 1 st, dc in next st, dc in sp, dc in next st, ch 1; repeat from * to corner, ending with ch 1, 3 dc in centre st of corner, ch 1, dc in next st, dc in sp, dc in next st, ** ch 1, skip 1 st, dc in next st, dc in sp, dc in next st; repeat from ** ending with ch 1, dc at

base of ch-3, sl st in top of ch-3. *Rnd 3:* Ch 3, dc at base of ch-3, ch 1, dc in next st, * dc in sp, dc in next st, ch 1, skip 1 st, dc in next st; repeat from * to corner, ch 1, 3 dc in centre st of corner, ch 1, dc in next st, ** dc in sp, dc in next st, ch 1, skip 1 st, dc in next st; repeat from **, ending with ch 1, dc at base of ch-3, sl st in top of ch-3. *Rnd 4:* Ch 3, * dc in sp, dc in next st, ch 1, skip 1 st, dc in next st; repeat from *, ending with ch 1, skip 1 st, sl st in top of ch-3. *Rnd 5:* Ch 4, skip 1 st, * dc in next st, dc in sp, dc in next st, ch 1, skip 1 st; repeat from * around. Join with sl st. Repeat last 2 rnds until 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ " from beg. End off.

FINISHING: Mark centre sp at top of 1 side of bag. Sew rhinestones in marked sp and working on diagonal towards right, sew rhinestones in sp of each row to lower edge. Sew diagonal to left in same way. Finish beading, following chart. Insert lining and tack




■ — RHINESTONE	+ — LARGE PEARL

starting ch into lower seam of lining. Sew end patterns of last row to lining at base of hinge at each side. Sew side edges of bag around base of frame.

H a t

Ch 4, join with sl st to form a ring. *Rnd 1:* Ch 3, 11 dc in ring, join with sl st top of ch-3. *Rnd 2:* Ch 3, dc at base of ch-3, 2 dc in each st around [24 dc]. Join with sl st. *Rnd 3:* Ch 3, 2 dc in next st, ch 1, * dc in next st, 2 dc in next st, ch 1; repeat from * around. Join with sl st [12 sps and 12 groups]. *Rnd 4:* Ch 4, skip 1 st, * dc in next st, dc in sp, dc in next st, ch 1, skip 1 st, dc in next st, 3 dc in sp, dc in next st (inc), ch 1, skip 1 st; repeat from * around, ending with 3 dc in sp. Join with sl st in 3rd ch of ch-4. *Rnd 5:* Ch 3, dc in sp, dc in next st, * ch 1, skip 1 st, dc in next st, dc in sp, dc in next st, ch 1, skip 1 st, 3 dc in next st (inc), ch 1, skip 1 st, dc in next st, dc in sp, dc in next st; repeat from *, ending with inc, ch 1, skip 1 st and join [18 sps=18 groups]. *Rnd 6:* Ch 4, * skip 1 st, dc in

next st, 3 dc in sp, dc in next st, (ch 1, skip 1 st, dc in next st, dc in sp, dc in next st) twice, ch 1; repeat from * ending with dc in last space. Join in 3rd ch of ch-4. *Rnd 7*: Ch 3, dc in sp, dc in next st, * ch 1, skip 1 st, 3 dc in next st (ch 1, skip 1 st, dc in next st, dc in sp, dc in next st) 3 times; repeat from * around. Join last ch-1 with sl st to top of ch-3 [24 sps=24 groups]. Continue to increase 6 sps and 6 groups every other round until there are 36 sps and 36 groups (alternating increases). Work even until 9" from beg. End off. **FINISHING**: Sew 1 small pearl in each sp on 3rd rnd from beg of hat. Sew rhinestones in every 3rd sp on 5th rnd, large pearls in every 3rd sp on 7th rnd, rhinestones on 9th rnd, small pearls on 11th rnd and rhinestones on 13th rnd. Turn up cuff and beg at last row (wrong side of hat is right side of cuff), sew rhinestones in every 9th sp along edge. * Working diagonally down to right, sew rhinestones in sp on each row until there are 10 rhinestones, then diagonally up to next rhinestone on edge; repeat from * around. Sew other trim as shown.
